Introductions and Welcome

Speaker: Logan Robertson, Associate Director Front Porch Home Match (formerly Covia) senior living communities and programs

33 affordable housing, 19 market rate, 6 community service programs to promote connections. Their work is in 4 areas: Nutrition, Social Connections, Creative Engagement, and Housing

Home Match services Alameda, Central Contra Costa, SF, and Marin counties. Home match works to promote home sharing to help both home providers and home seekers. One benefit is the social connection. They are not able to provide services to individuals who need assistance with daily living or with dementia.

They match providers and seekers and make the process easy and comfortable. And much safer than Facebook searches. They ensure rooms are habitable and vet participants then match spaces with home seekers. They do formal background checks of both seekers and providers and help with lease agreements. (including a living together agreement on things like who controls the thermostat!). They provide on-going assistance so people can make adjustments as things go on. The timing on the process to find a home match is variable and can take up to a month. Cost is variable and can include task exchanges but not medical care or assistance with daily living. Successful providers and seekers should have healthy communication skills and be adaptable.

Funding for Contra Costa is very limited so they can only serve central county. They started with seniors and now serve anyone 18 and up. Most providers are older women and Home Match is actively looking for more providers. 

Loaves and Fishes of Contra Costa Meals Provided (Walnut Creek)


