Proposal: Develop a concise one-page document addressing affordable housing myths.


Suggestions put forward to broaden the workshop's outreach strategies.

CORE Update – Shared by Donna. It was observed that there were more men than women that accessed services in October whereas in the past we saw more women than men accessing services.
